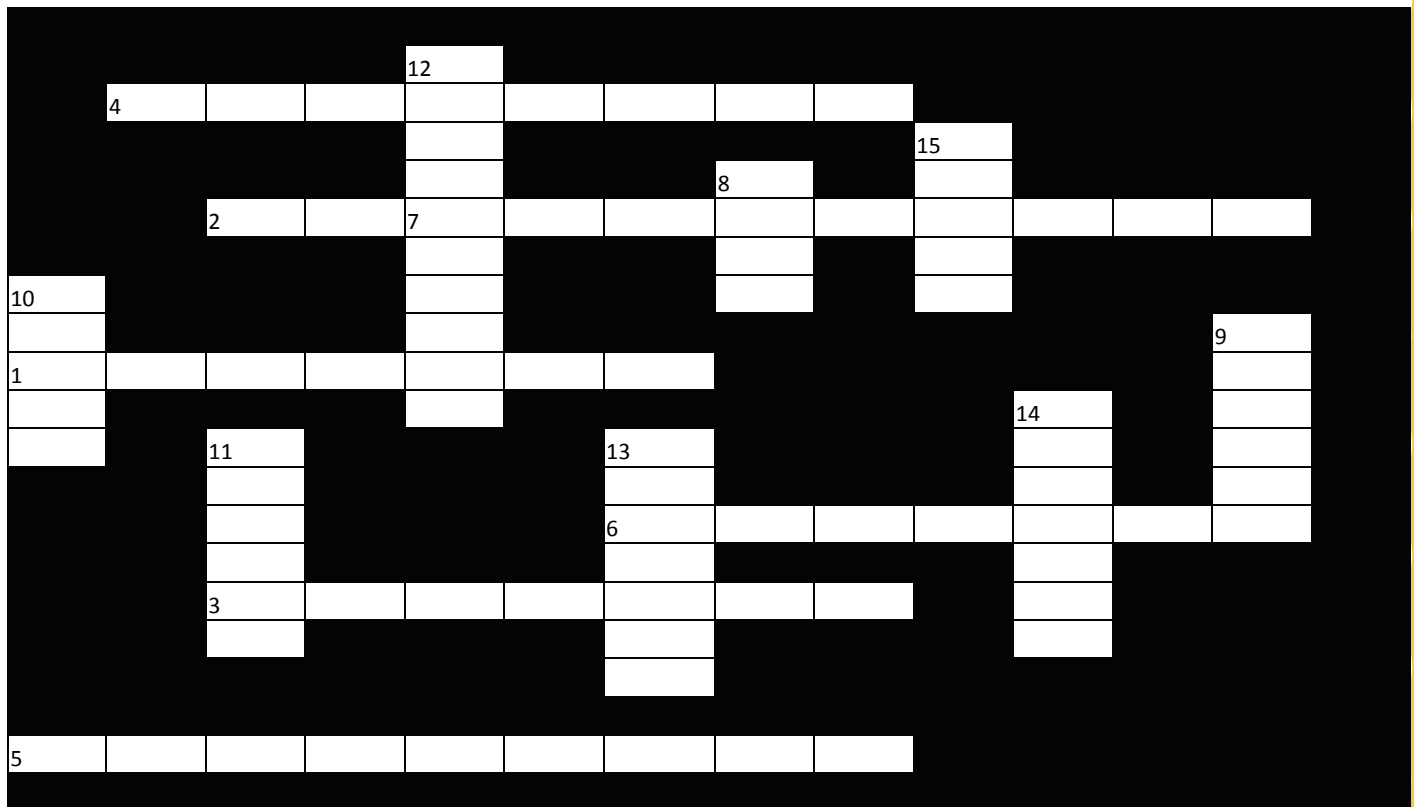

*Political Science 492 Constitutional Law. It is exhilarating to learn about US History, the cases, and the Constitution.*



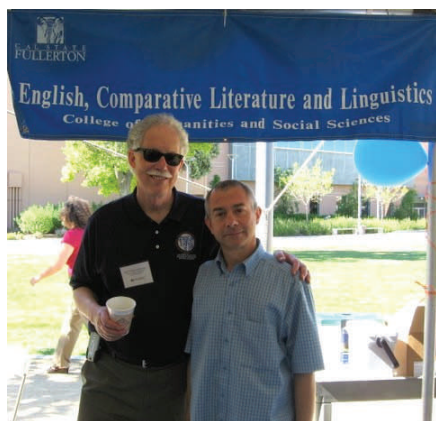
## Welcome To Fullerton Day
