a. Chair - Colleen Curtis

• HSS Week is almost here. It starts on March 23. We want to go over events for each club throughout the week. On Monday will be the opening ceremony. Friday will be the closing ceremony in the Pub

• Last week it was discussed to allocate funds from HSS Week in order to help fund the band/dancers, etc. Added to the agenda.

• Contingency funding: A meeting has been set up to meet with Gary. The meetings will happen in late April. This means that any events done before this meeting will probably not get funded. ASSA: What does this mean for clubs already funded? This means that the groups will probably not get funded for their events. We discussed suspending asking for funds until the contingency meeting happens and funds are gotten. Is there a motion to suspend the allocation request. I will meet with Gary and get you dates and times next week.

b. Vice Chair - Natasha Bonner

• Budget: the money in 8074 is \$990.30. And 8077 is at \$41.63. I am going over all packets submitted. I will also be going over the ESBR.

ESBR: I wrote down more notes. I have written down all the clubs who requested • funding. We have spent \$4,970.03 of HSS Week funds. If we wanted to ask funds for catering, can we do so? It is very tight right now. If you asked beforehand, we would honor that request. CR: Question about the 8074 and 8077. We are allocating the remaining money solely for club events. The remaining balance for HSS Week is \$1,029.70. We have to cross out shirts and stickers because the funds are not there. Balloons are still viable because of the ability to get them free on campus. I will talk to Drew about this today. We are in the process of getting contingency funds for all of the clubs who asked for it. LSA: We will not be spending all of our funding for our speaker. We could use the funding that will not be used in order to help cover the cost. Dean: I will cover the cost of the Pizza that will be distributed during the opening ceremony. SSDP: We are also not using some of our funding. That can go back into the line items. CR: With this extra money, we might be able to fund some of the things that we couldn't cover before. All of the history of club funding should be up there for all to see. I am still in the process of updating the lists. They will be done over the weekend.
