ii. Acacia would like to request \$825 from line item 8077 for Forrest Montgomery to attend the Religion in Society conference at UC Berkeley on April 16th & 17th. Forrest's MA project has a very narrow focus, and there are few conferences where he can network with faculty in his chosen area to help him with his project and to decide on future PhD programs. Resultantly, this will probably be the only conference he attends during his entire graduate career at CSUF.
