Julianne &amp; Natalie – Retention Specialists for H&amp;SS College <ul> <li>As student leaders, we juggle many different positions and it's vital that we also prioritize our academics, on top of work, family, and personal lives.</li> <li>b. Academic Probation – students may be put on academic probation for many different reasons including work, family, or health. When a student's Cumulative or CSUF GPA falls below 2.0, they are put on Academic Probation.</li> <li>c. In order to get off Academic Probation, students must raise their Cumulative or CSUF GPA to above 2.0.</li> <li>d. CSUF GPA &amp; Cumulative GPA can be found on the TDA. CSUF GPA is made up of the classes taken only at CSUF, whereas the Cumulative GPA consists of both CSUF classes and classes taken at other colleges. CSUF GPAs are often lower for Transfer Students after their first semester at CSUF.</li> <li>e. Term GPA and Major GPA is not used when determining Academic Probation.</li> <li>f. One of the tools useful during our time at CSUF is the GPA Calculator. It can be found on the Academic Advisement Center page, or by googling Academic Advisement CSUF GPA Calculator. Using the GPA calculator, you can simulate different semester outcomes to see how those outcomes will affect your CSUF and Cumulative GPA.</li> <li>g. If you completed an undergraduate degree at CSUF and return for a graduate degree, your undergraduate classes will not affect your GPA as a graduate student.</li> </ul></li></ul>

		<ul> <li>h. Grade Forgiveness – If you take a course and fail it but know that you can do better if you were to take it again, you can retake it. You can "forgive" up to 16 credits at CSUF.</li> <li>i. Students who are on academic probation will work with Natalie &amp; Julianne in order to complete the Semester Contract.</li> <li>j. When students are on academic probation, they may only take up to 13 units and cannot receive financial aid.</li> <li>k. Workshops can provide necessary study skills and support, or you can schedule a meeting with Natalie &amp; Julianne at ROOM NUMBER HERE</li> <li>B. Dr. Jessica Stern – Interim Associate Dean of Student Relations <ul> <li>a. The dean's office provides a unifying vision and main agendas for the year, for the college.</li> <li>b. Dr. Stern acts as the first person students can approach with an issue that cannot be resolved by your department.</li> <li>c. Dr. Stern is working with student leaders in order to better support student leaders.</li> <li>d. Her office can be found at H211.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
