- Chair – Jacqueline Montero
  - Reminder that each org is required to participate in the H&SS Week Resource Fair, as well as host an event throughout the week.
  - Event information for H&SS Week needs to be submitted by March 8<sup>th</sup> in order to give time for marketing team.
  - Executive Senate Meeting
    - i. Commencement will be moved to weekdays instead of weekends. This will be the last year for weekend commencements. Staff & Faculty will already be working during the weekday.
      - 1. Will there be an opportunity for student feedback? Weekday commencement will be difficult for many student families.
        - a. No, they said that because they give 9 month's notice arrangements should be able to be made in advance. There is an email provided where you can voice your feedback. [Commencement@fullerton.edu](mailto:Commencement@fullerton.edu)
        - b. No undergraduate students were involved in the decision, other than ASI representatives.
      - 2. There will only be two venues available, whereas in the past there have been ten. Ceremony times have been cut back from four hours to two hours.
- Vice Chair/ Treasurer - Mir Aminy
  - Regular office hours in 211b. Office hours will be sent over GroupMe.
- Director of Administration – Gabriella Cuna

- Housing Liaison – Ashley Bevan
  - No reports.
- Advisor – Connie Moreno Yamashiro, Assistant Dean
  - Registration dates changing. For summer, registration will begin March 25<sup>th</sup>. For Fall, April 15<sup>th</sup>. Typically, registration takes place over summer, but research has shown that summer registration stands as a barrier to entry because students are busy or not checking their email over the break.
    - i. Will the anticipated aid notice still be available for financial aid?
      - 1. I'm not sure, but I know students are following up. I will be following up as well.
    - ii. If somebody is graduating in the spring and applying for graduate school but have not been accepted yet, how are they to register for their graduate classes?
      - 1. I am not sure. I am not involved in this process and simply wanted to inform y'all but can take your questions to the people involved. If you are unsure after further guidance, please start seeing your advisors ASAP, whether that be a major or general

education advisor. If you wait until April, wait times will be greatly increased.

- There was a conversation a few weeks ago regarding GPA and lack of academic support from advisors. I have spoken with the dean regarding this issue and we have been working to determine how we can better support our student leaders. We will be sharing an academic advising workshop on March 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Miguel & I will not be here next Friday due to a conference. We will be sharing our notes with y'all when we return.
- GH 211b still has yet to be officially named. For now, it is called H&SS Student Success Center South.
- Graduate Assistant – Miguel Quirarte
  - CAPS center provides wellness counselling, mental and physical. We participated in the Art of Wellness Workshop as an executive board. The Art of Wellness flier will be passed out.
  - CalFresh Outreach & Enrollment Day is next week. As students we are extremely busy, but nutrition is extremely important.
  - Imposter Syndrome Workshop flier passed out as well.
  - Emails sent to those who I have not received a presentation. The deadline is Thursday February 28<sup>th</sup>.
- ASI Liaisons – Maria Linares and John Good
  - ASI Monthly Report
    - i. Vacancy filled.
    - ii. Lower GPA Requirement did not pass but lead to a larger conversation about academic support of student leaders.
    - iii. Approaching deadline for scholarships.
    - iv. Fully Informed Podcasts released.
  - CSSA
    - i. Chief Governmental Officers from the CSUs were present to discuss what has been happening on their campus.
    - ii. Discussed support for Black students and wrote a resolution to support students of color following an incident at Humboldt University. This resolution also included support to undocumented students who are not legally allowed to work on campus.
      - 1. We must be mindful of who we elect. One representative spoke against helping undocumented students.
    - iii. SQE protest on Saturday morning protesting the President of San Francisco State.
      - 1. Chair yielded to Liz Sanchez.
        - a. Student Activists on SF campus were taken to rooms and interrogated. I have experienced this, as well as others on our campus and other campuses. What can our ASI liaisons do to prevent and speak out against these events?
          - i. Student Life and Leadership gives students the opportunity to speak on campus. This is not something that the ASI liaisons can do.
            - 1. We appreciate that the ASI liaisons have the ability to take our concerns to higher positions. We understand that you may not have all the answers now, but we hope that you can take these concerns to others.
          - ii. As ASI leaders, we have received pushback from ASI when we

address concerns. We need ASI student leaders who are not afraid to be outspoken about the concerns of students. I know that coming out of high school, we are taught that we need to be obedient, but the staff and ASI works for us, we need to demand that they are accountable.

  - iii. There are a lot of perks to being an elected ASI official. Not only do you get to speak on behalf of the students you represent, but you also qualify for priority registration, faculty parking, and a financial award.

    - i. Yes, as an honor society we want to encourage students to speak with their professors and office hours can be intimidating for new students. Meeting and interacting with

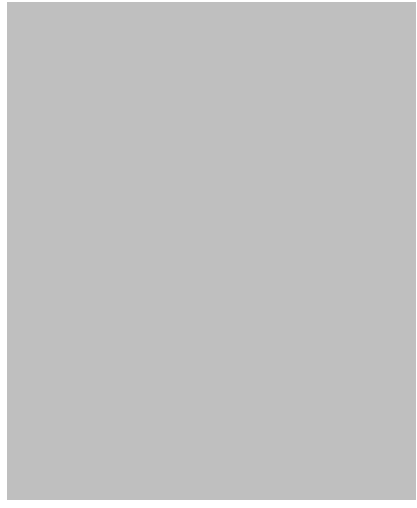
professors is extremely important and we hope to make this a series of workshops so that we can introduce students to professors in an informal environment.

- B. Philosophy Club is requesting \$9243 from Line Item 8074 for the 2019 Philosophy Symposium, which will take place April 11th-12th during H&SS Week. The topic will be "Diversity Question in Feminist Philosophy of Science." The Vice President of the Philosophy Club, Mariana Gomez, has accompanied the representative in order to answer any questions. They have revised their proposal. The new one has been distributed. A breakdown of printing & distribution costs has been provided and thus the amount has changed.
  - Operational costs serve as a buffer in case of emergency. If this is a deal breaker, we can move forward without the operational costs. And of course, this proposal is the maximum that we are able to be reimbursed. If this cost is not encountered, we will not be using the funds.
  - Are we getting quotes from the speakers regarding hotel costs and flights?
    - i. Because the honoraria are all inclusive, quotes are not provided. The speakers will be keeping anything that is not used, and thus are motivated to choose the lowest cost options.
  - Are your speakers currently on standby waiting for the council's approval?
    - i. Yes. One of our speakers is currently booked for the next nine years. We do not want to tell them to book flight and hotel only to not receive funding.

  - Will the event be wheelchair accessible?
    - i. Thank you for bringing this to my attention. This is not something that we have confirmed explicitly but I will ensure that it is. Thank you.
