edical Insurance

AIFS provides each student with a group insurance policy issued by the Ace American Insurance Company. Please see www.aifspartnerships.com/pdf/insurance_semester.pdf for full details of the insurance coverage, including the optional medical insurance upgrade and personal effects coverage.

Optional Extra Protection Insurance Coverage, including increased medical insurance (\$65) and/or personal effects insurance (\$90) as outlined in the AIFS insurance brochure.

rogram Fee Refund Policy

All notification of withdrawal must be made in writing via fax or certified mail to: Registrar, Customized, Faculty-Led Programs, AIFS Study Abroad. 1 High Ridge Park, Stamford, CT 06905. The fax number is

203.399.5597. Postmark date or date of fax transmission is considered date of withdrawal. All withdrawal statements must be signed by the applicant, or they will not be processed.

- If a student withdraws on or before Thursday, March 14, 2019, a full refund will be made less \$125, plus any non-refundable deposits paid either by the student or by AIFS on the student's behalf.
- If a student withdraws after Thursday, March 14, 2019, but on or before Friday, April 12, 2019, a full refund will be made less \$450, plus any non-refundable deposits paid either by the student or by AIFS on the student's behalf.
- If a student is forced to withdraw from the program because of covered medical reasons after final fees have been paid but before departure, a refund will be made through the Fees Refund and Medical Insurance Policy, less a \$150 processing fee, and the \$125 insurance premium. The policy requires written proof of medical reasons provided by your physician.
- Students withdrawing voluntarily for any reason after Friday, April 12, 2019, including withdrawals because of medical reasons not covered under the medical refund policy, receive no refund of fees paid unless they are able to provide a qualified replacement. In this case, they receive a full refund of all payments made less the \$150 processing fee and any non-refundable deposits.
- Replacement students must pay in full at the time of Application. Flights cannot be arranged for replacement students applying after Thursday, March 14, 2019. Once the program has started, students withdrawing receive no refund under any circumstances. This refund policy is necessary because the booking of facilities in Berlin requires substantial nonrefundable payments and commitments by AIFS in advance.

ptional Excursion

Prague Weekend - \$495

A three-day, two-night excursion to Prague including round-trip,

standard-class train travel and accommodation in twin or triple-bedded rooms

on a bed and breakfast basis in a centrally located hotel.

This excursion also includes walking tours of historical Prague and the Jewish Quarter with the

services of a professional, English speaking guide, a traditional Czech group dinner, a travel pass for unlimited use on city buses, trams, subways, and funicular, and an AIFS representative for the duration of the excursion.

Please note that a 10-person minimum would be required for this excursion to run and the faculty member's participation is included in the excursion fee.

rogram Courses

HUM 350: German Life and Culture (3 units) [GE - C.3 & Z]

Humanities 350T German Life and Culture will introduce students to key aspects of German culture, politics, and society. We will explore what it means to be "German," and take as our premise that "Germanness" is a contested and constructed concept. We will examine the importance of local and regional cultures, architecture, religion, theater, music, and popular culture like food and soccer. The course will also analyze the ways in which Germans have defined "the other" throughout history along religious, ethnic, and racial lines.

HIST 320: Modern Germany from the Third Reich to Contemporary Multiculturalism (3 units) [GE – D.5]

This class will draw on the rich cultural and historical resources of the city of Berlin to explore 20th Century German History. We will begin with the Weimar Republic, the progressive period after the First World War when Berlin was the center of avant-garde culture, a city that pushed accepted boundaries in art, culture, sexuality, and politics. We will then examine the rise of fascism and Third Reich, exploring the consequences of extreme nationalism and racism that culminated in the Holocaust.
