edical Insurance

AIFS provides each student with a group insurance policy issued by the Ace American Insurance Company. Please see www.aifspartnerships.com/pdf/insurance_semester.pdf for full details of the insurance coverage, including the optional medical insurance upgrade and personal effects coverage.

Optional Extra Protection Insurance Coverage, including increased medical insurance (\$65) and/or personal effects insurance (\$90) as outlined in the AIFS insurance brochure.

rogram Fee Refund Policy

All notification of withdrawal must be made in writing via fax or certified mail to: Registrar, Customized, Faculty-Led Programs, AIFS Study Abroad,

1 High Ridge Park, Stamford, CT 06905. The fax number is 203.399.5597. Postmark date or date of fax transmission is considered date of withdrawal. All withdrawal statements must be signed by the applicant, or they will not be processed.

- If a student withdraws on or before Wednesday, October 31, 2018, a full
 refund will be made less \$150, plus any non-refundable deposits paid either
 by the student or by AIFS on the student's behalf.
- If a student withdraws after Wednesday, October 31, 2018, but on or before
 Friday, November 30, 2018, a full refund will be made less \$450, plus any
 non-refundable deposits paid either by the student or by AIFS on the
 student's behalf.
- If a student is forced to withdraw from the program because of covered medical reasons after final fees have been paid but before departure, a refund will be made through the Fees Refund and Medical Insurance Policy, less a \$150 processing fee, and the \$210 insurance premium. The policy requires written proof of medical reasons provided by your physician.
- Students withdrawing voluntarily for any reason after Friday, November 30, 2018, including withdrawals because of medical reasons not covered under the medical refund policy, receive no refund of fees paid unless they are able to provide a qualified replacement. In this case, they receive a full refund of all payments made less the \$150 processing fee and any non-refundable deposits.
- Replacement students must pay in full at the time of Application. Flights
 cannot be arranged for replacement students applying after Wednesday,
 October 31, 2018. Once the program has started, students withdrawing
 receive no refund under any circumstances. This refund policy is necessary
 because the booking of facilities in London requires substantial nonrefundable payments and commitments by AIFS in advance.

rogram Fees Estimated

The fee per person is: HOMESTAY ACCOMMODATION - \$8,545 APARTMENT ACCOMMODATION - \$9,945

ptional Excursion

Scotland Tour

Visit the highlands and islands of beautiful Scotland on this optional 4-day, 3-night excursion. The cost is **\$595**. The tour includes:

- · Round-trip train transfers between London and Edinburgh
- 3 nights hostel accommodation with daily breakfast (1 night in Edinburgh, 1 night in Loch Ness and 1 night on the Isle of Skye)
- 3 day guided bus tour of the highlands and the islands of Scotland
- Evening meals and the services of an AIFS staff member throughout the journey

rogram Courses

Students must enroll in at least 12 units.

HUM 350: British Life & Culture (REQUIRED) (3 units) | GE - C.3 & Z|

This course is an interdisciplinary introduction to contemporary British culture and related issues through a combination of travel and study. Students will be introduced to some principles and methods useful for analyzing cultures and their own interactions with them.

ART 311: Foundations of Modern Art (3 units) [GE - C.3]

(Tentative, pending approval by the Department of Visual Arts)

In the London program, we will visit a wide variety of museums and art collections across the city that hold spectacular collections of art, focusing on works from the 18th century to the end of the 19th century. In addition to painting and sculpture, we will also look at decorative arts and architecture.

GEOG 373: Global Cuisines (3 units) [GE - E]

In the London program, we will focus on past and present cuisines of London, including migrant cuisines and the relationships between food and empire. In particular we will examine the influx of new foods from Britain's expanding colonial trade in the 17th to 19th centuries, and the rise of immigrant cuisines including Chinese, Indian, African and Afro-Caribbean.

POSC 350: World Politics in the 21st Century (3 units) [GE - D.5]

This applied course explains the nature of contemporary world politics and explores contemporary processes and developments in global politics. The course examines the role and power of a variety of political and economic actors, such governments, international organizations, and multinational corporations. Students will examine the workings of organizations such as the United Nations, the European Union, the World Trade Organization, and the International Monetary Fund, and become familiar with policy debates surrounding these key institutions of political and economic governance.

HUM 495: Internship (3 units)

CSUF students can choose to participate in an unpaid work placement during their stay in London. This program complements classroom learning with practical experience in an international workplace and develops personal skills and strengths that will assist in creating future job opportunities and building a competitive résumé. Internships are available for students in any major.

HUM 499 or 599: Independent Research Study (3 units)

These courses are independent study or research projects that are arranged by a selected faculty member within your major department.
